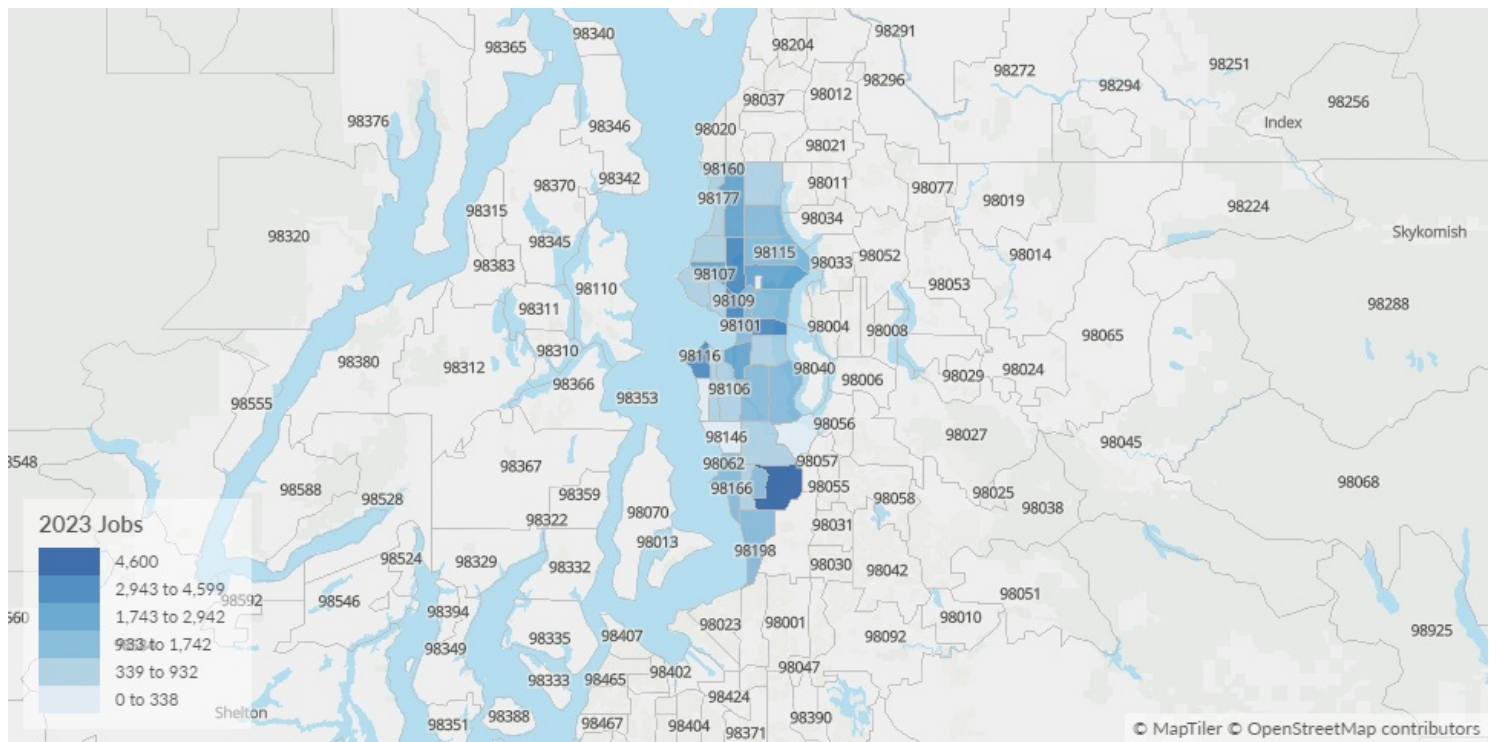

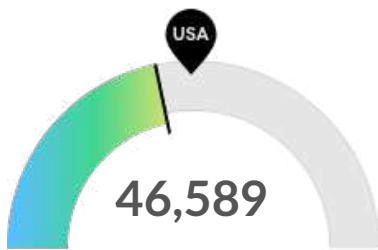

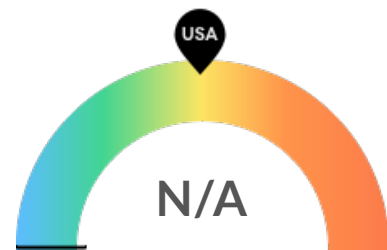
**Supply (Jobs)**

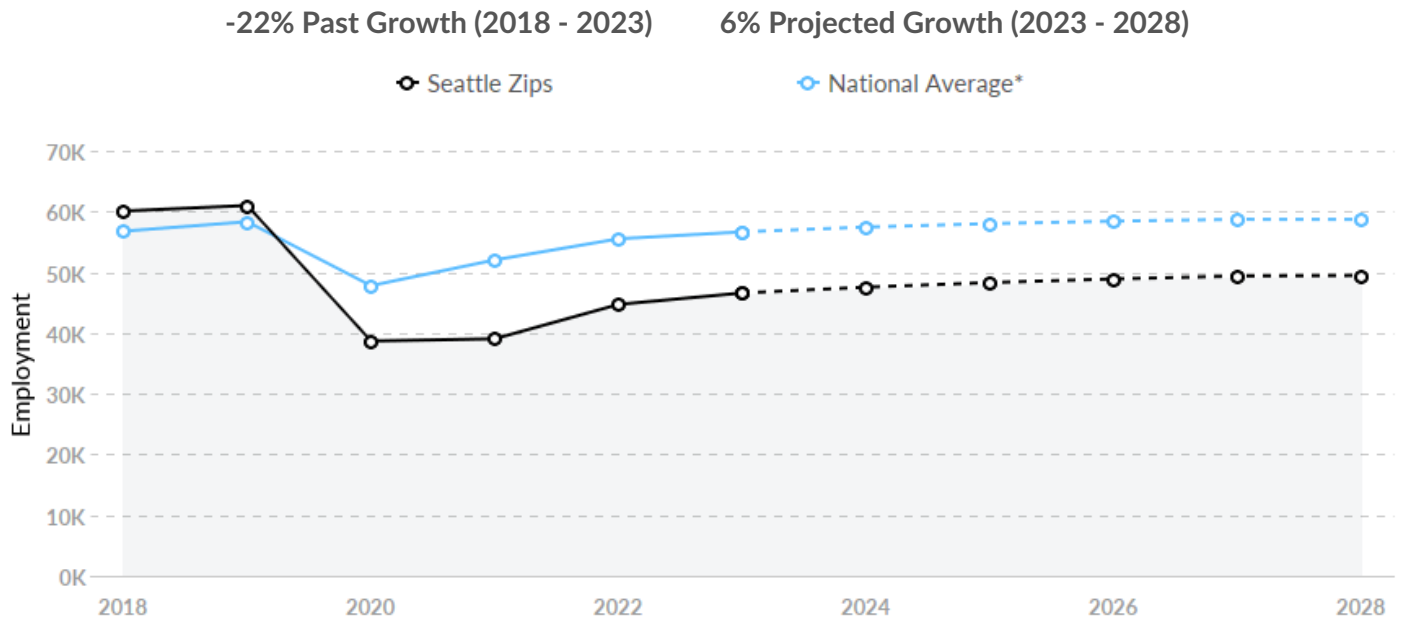

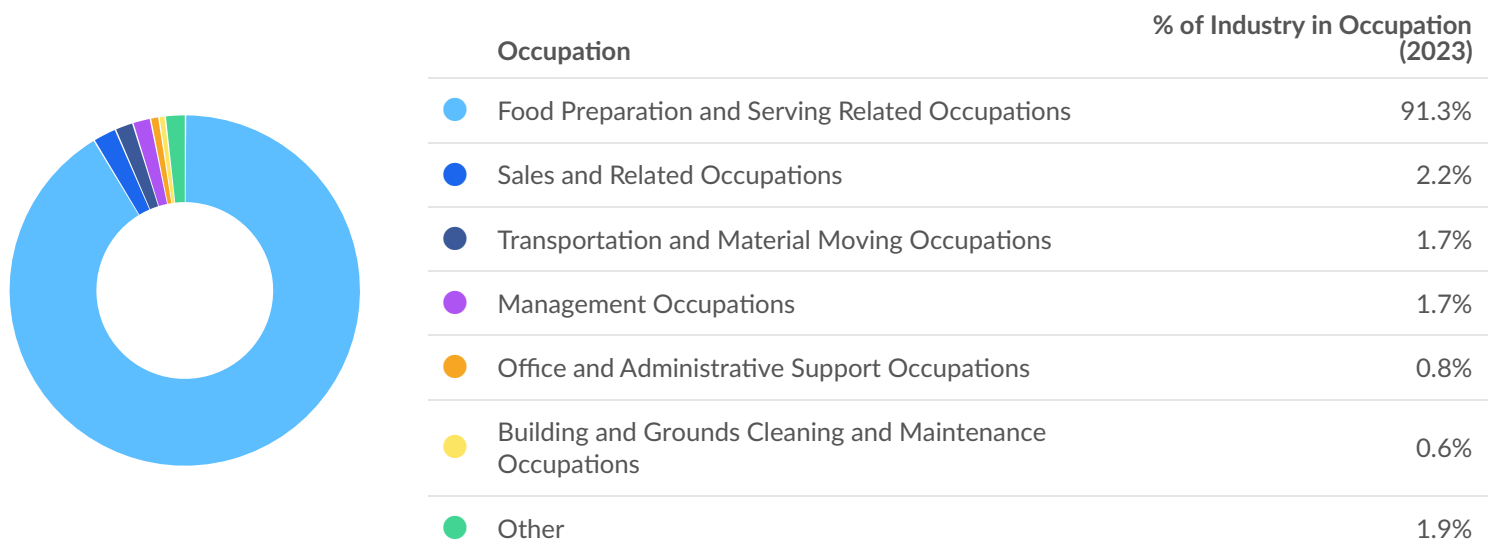

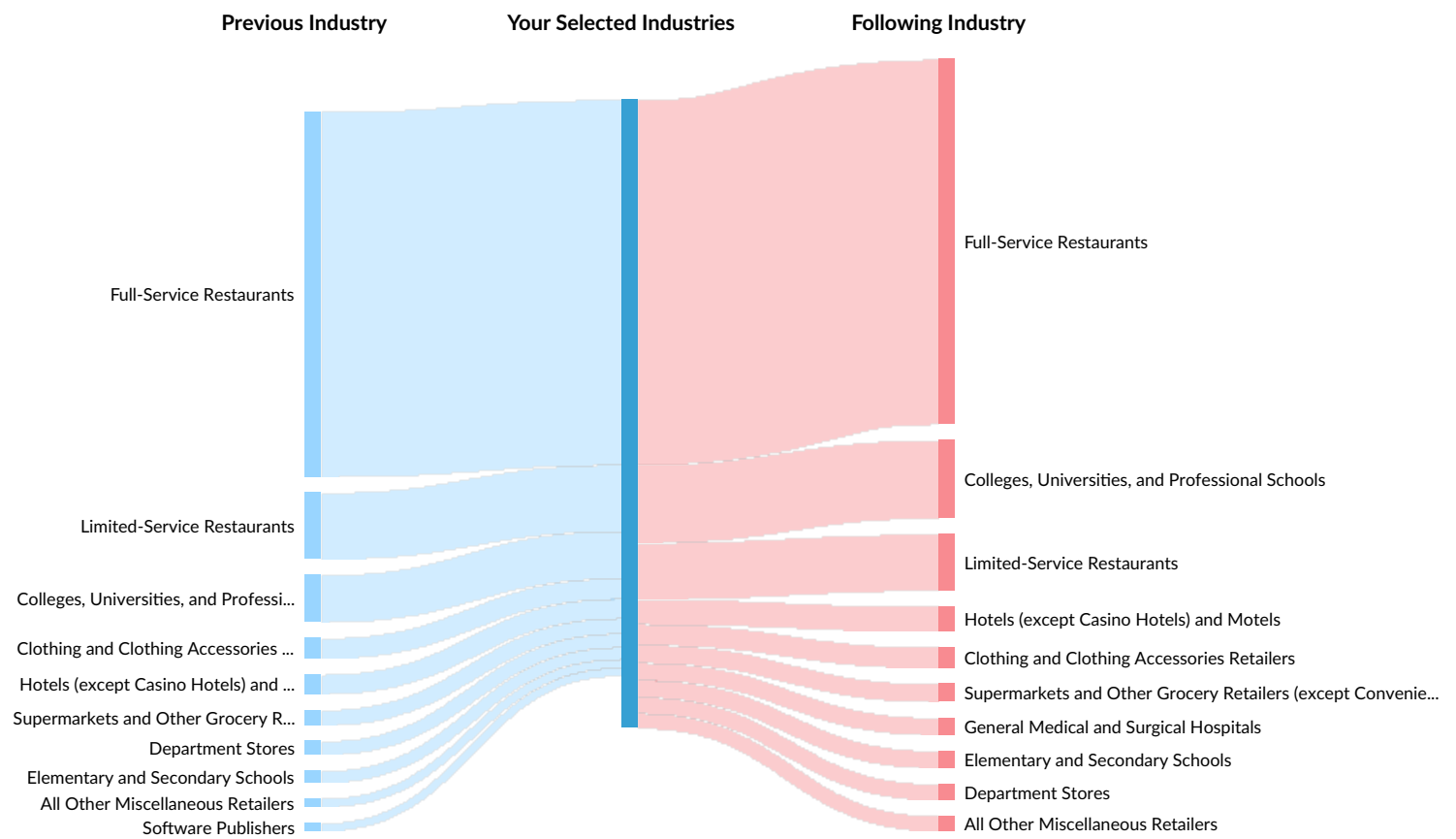
